- Little libraries (numerous free libraries in the community)
- Little Free Pantry (one located at north end of community)

- “small hill with a tree” (a favourite spot mentioned by a student)

- Community craft fair (organized by The Thorncliffe/Greenview Women’s league annually)

- Corpus Christi School (contributed significantly to the ideas for this project)
- Colonel Sanders School
- Shoe repair (home business in Thorncliffe)
- Nose Creek
- Basketball
- Egerts Park
- Bike Path along creek (access to downtown and beyond, a quiet, enjoyable pathway)
- Pilates (at community centre; a highlight for a resident who suggested this)
- Crab apples along Nose Creek (fun to pick and snack on along the path)
- A sewing and ESL program (hosted at Park Hill Estates and run by volunteers from Centre Street church for a long time)
- Neighbours (friendly ones, and familiar ones)
- Skate Park (on 64th, community centre got it going based on feedback from local youth)
- Rabbits (long-eared neighbours)
- Deer (at Nose Hill)
- Benches (sit-spots throughout the neighbourhood)
- Outdoor movies (hosted by a Greenview resident)
